Admission Requirements

Those who have completed Bachelor of Arts degree in Humanities and Social Sciences or related areas such as Education, Law, Business Studies and Public Policy and from a recognized University are eligible to apply. Graduates from other universities and colleges are also eligible for admission.

The candidates should have a minimum of three (3) years of work experience in government, private or public sector. Teachers, public servants, police officers, law and order

enforcement officers will be encouraged to apply.

All students must complete a Postgraduate Diploma in Professional Writing (PGDPW) before admission to the MPW. Students enter MPW via the PGDPW.

The candidates must be fluent in English and also must be computer literate.
